Reports from the Field

Despite the early challenges, Manna team and distributors in the local communities have continuously registered good success in the distribution of Manna Bible Commentaries. Most especially Pastors who now work with the internally displaced families share their testimonies of the growing prayer houses amongst these displaced people group. They basically use Manna Bible Commentary for teaching and discipleship ministry. They do not have any other ministry tools only the Manna Books.

There are over three hundred thousand internally displaced persons in the war torn villages in the English speaking regions of Cameroon. We cannot reach them all. Their locations and hiding places are in thick forest, caves and rocky areas. Pray for pastors and Manna distributors who take up the challenge, waving all dangers along the way to share and comfort with them.

Rev. Bublack Thaddeus is in charge of Manna Commentaries in the Magha Field in the West region of Cameroon. He reports that “overwhelmingly the churches in the Magha field are experiencing spiritual growth. The Manna Bible Commentary has sparked a new evangelism move within churches and communities. The executive Field pastor personally has expressed satisfaction with Manna literature ministry.

Testimony from Pastor Enoch. “It has been my very first time to introduce bible study in my church using Manna Bible Commentary. We regularly have 15 to 25 attendants. But since the introduction of

Manna study materials, the bible study and discipleship class moved from 25 to 75 attendants. The second and third week it moved to 80 people in attendants. Averagely I can report that, now we have a regular attendant of 60 people weekly for bible study. Thank you Manna Books, we are excited with what God is doing in our churches and communities. Thank you!

News From Douala

Francis reports that the Spanish church where he had distributed Manna books is for the very first time training 25 baptismal candidates to be baptized ever since the church was established. The church leaders are considering starting up a Spanish Manna study centre for the church community. They have raised funds to start up with the literature study centre.

-Since we operate in rural communities it’s been lots of problems and sometimes we cancel meetings due to either the road network or cost of hiring 4WD Hilux into the very interior parts hence the need to have a permanent vehicle, this problems will be solved. Moving equipment’s and other tools is no easy task, the continues suicide bombers are affecting our ministry as new security measures have been put in place. We need to do what is correct to serve souls through evangelism.



-Our vocational training workshop and adult education and remedial classes for weak pupils and sometimes provide books, uniforms and shoes is naturally a demanding task that we have to supplement on our own, given now that schools are reopening with many natural and human created obstacle, you may be willing to support a school child, why not get in touch with us. Pray for our community projects to be funded.

-Many rural girls find it very difficult to pay school fees and thus stay back at homewhen parents can not afford as a result of poverty, the future of these children are in danger, we need to raise support through community projects that will inverst skills in these rural farmers to improve on their yields and market strategis to alleviate them from poverty and future for their children.



-LISAC needs used Bibles and Christian literatures for ministry use as they are expensive and on limited supply in Cameroon, local communities will hardly have access.
